

ESTATE MATTERS

Park Royal Hotel

After months of pressure from your Committee and from local Councillors enforcement action has now taken place to clear the hotel car park of the various unauthorised activities such as the car wash and tyre sales which were taking place there. We have also learned that the hotel business who intended to use the site after the development have now withdrawn and Indigo Planning are no longer actively involved. However the existing hotel is now being used for the storage of painting and decorating supplies. Your Committee is investigating whether or not a Change of Use Application has not been made and is contacting the Fire Service to determine whether the storage of large quantities of paint is a fire risk.

Connell Crescent

Concern has been expressed to the Council regarding coaches parking on the pavement outside the Premier Inn and damaging the pavement. There is also concern about coaches attempting to travel through the Crescent itself. Councillor Sumner has taken this up on our behalf. Your Committee would like to thank local residents who are monitoring these problems and also contributing to the discussion about how to improve the traffic situation here.

Primary School, Hanger Vale Lane

The number of children at the school has increased considerably this term and some concerns have been expressed about noise. Your Committee continues to monitor the situation although nothing requiring action has yet been reported.

Hanger Lane Woodland Pathway

There were some problems with rubbish dumping particularly from street drinkers over the summer period. At your Committee's request, the Council did clean up and the woodland path has remained much tidier. Please do report any incidents of dumping here or elsewhere on the estate.

Crime and Security

Despite occasional spikes, crime levels continue to be low compared to other areas. At various times local residents have enquired about the feasibility of employing private security contractors to patrol the estate. Your Committee would like to thank former HHERA Secretary Graham Fowler for researching this on our behalf. As discussed at the last AGM indicated, there are mixed feelings about this idea, and Graham's research left your Committee with many outstanding questions about both the financial viability and practical effectiveness of such schemes. We will report back when we have more information. In the meantime, as ever, please be careful and vigilant, and report anything remotely suspicious to the Police. Their response to a recent break-in on the Estate was encouragingly swift and thorough although sadly no arrests have yet been made.
